Morning session:

Through the looking glass: Using literary texts to promote language learning Gillian Lazar (Senior Lecturer, Middlesex University)

Literary texts offer language learners unique opportunities for engagement through their playfulness and sense of an alternative reality, while also enhancing the language awareness and interpretive abilities of learners. Yet such texts are sometimes considered too linguistically challenging or culturally inaccessible for use with language learners. This session aims to address such challenges by beginning with a consideration of some recent theoretical perspectives regarding the use of literary texts in language teaching. We will then explore a range of participatory activities which can be used to exploit different literary genres with students at varying levels of linguistic proficiency.

Bio: Gillian Lazar is a Senior Lecturer at Middlesex University, London. Prior to that, she worked as a freelance teacher trainer, lexicographer and materials writer. She has also worked as a teacher at the British Council, Athens and teacher / teacher trainer at International House, London. She has run workshops for teachers in France, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Denmark, South Africa, Germany and Hungary. She has written materials for the BBC World Service and has contributed articles to magazines and journals, including the English Language Teaching Journal, TESOL Quarterly and English Teaching Professional. She is the author of Literature and Language Teaching: A Guide for Teachers and Trainers (1993), A Window on Literature (1999) and Meanings and Metaphors (2003).

Afternoon session:

Transmediality: Literature and social media

Blanca González-Valencia (Spanish Language Tutor, University of Manchester)

What can be learnt from transferring characters and events from the page of a novel to the interface of social media? The idea behind this session is to encourage students and teachers to read literature (and films) from a different perspective. The set of activities is designed to bring some discussion to the language class about historical and contemporary issues by imagining how some of the characters would deal with social media.

Bio: Blanca González-Valencia is a Spanish Language Tutor at the University of Manchester. She has an MA in Translation Studies, an extensive experience in teaching Spanish as a Foreign Language and has delivered talks and workshops on translation and contextualization, nonverbal communication in the language class, and more recently, in the use of transmedia narratives to support learning activities.
