Thinking about **new voices** – in prose and poetry – that have arisen in the Latin-American universe after the passing of writers acclaimed during the Boom, about **new languages** used by those writers, and about **new readings** proposed by them means to open our horizon for a reality that surrounds us and does not limit us due to our differences or to lack of knowledge. Instead, it makes us seek for a fruitful and productive dialogue with the Other, with the new, with something that has just begun and with those who share the same history and future.

Letters, words, ideas were and still are the best means for building a society that seeks human and responsible knowledge in all areas. Our goal in this opportunity is to build up together, listening to those new voices, paying attention to new languages, and sharing new readings.

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LECTURERS

João Almino (Brazil)

Writer and diplomat. Holds a doctorate degree in History from École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales (France). Author of Quinteto de Brasília, composed of the novels *Idéias para Onde Passar o Fim do Mundo*, *Samba-Enredo, As Cinco Estações do Amor, O Livro das Emoções*, and *Cidade Livre. Enigmas da primavera* is his most recent novel. Winner of Prêmio Casa de las Américas and Prêmio Passo Fundo Zaffari & Bourbon de Literatura. Has written important essays pertaining to History and Political Philosophy. He has also taught at UNAM (Mexico), UnB, Instituto Rio Branco, Berkeley, Stanford, and the University of Chicago.

Susanne Klengel (Germany)

Professor, researcher, and translator. Holds a post-doctorate from Martin-Luther-Universität Halle-Wittenberg, with *Venia Legendi* for Literature and Romance Studies. Holds a doctorate degree in Philologies of New Foreign Languages from Freie Universität Berlin. She is a professor of Literatures and Cultures of Latin America at the Lateinamerika-Institute of Freie Universität Berlin since 2009.

Ricardo Lísias (Brazil)

Writer and faculty member. Holds a doctorate degree in Brazilian Literature from Universidade de São Paulo. Author of the novels *Cobertor de estrelas*, *Duas praças*, *O livro dos mandarins*, *O céu dos suicidas*, and *Divórcio*, of the collection of short stories *Concentração e outros contos*, and of the series of e-books *Delegado Tobias*. Awarded with the prizes Portugal Telecom de Literatura Brasileira and Melhor Romancista da Associação Paulista de Críticos de Arte (APCA). He has been selected as one of *The best of young Brazilian novelists* by the British magazine *Granta*. He is currently undertaking a postdoctoral research at Unifesp

Ulises Juárez Polanco (Nicaragua)

Writer. Awarded with a fellowship granted by the Mexican government within the ambit of the Artists' Residency for Iberoamerican Creators. Awarded with the Valle-Inclán fellowship, granted by the Spanish government for creative residency at Real Academia de España, in Rome (2015-2016). Regarded by the International Book Fair of Guadalajara as one of the "25 best kept secrets of Latin America". Editor of the magazine *Carátula: revista cultural centroamericana*.

Veronica Stigger (Brazil)

Writer, faculty member, and art critic. Among other books, she has published *O trágico e outras comédias , Gran cabaret demenzial, Os añões* e *Opisanie swiata*, for which she has received the following literary prizes: Prêmio São Paulo de Literatura, Prêmio Machado de Assis, from Fundação Biblioteca Nacional, and Prêmio Açorianos. She holds a doctorate degree in Communication from Universidade de São Paulo, as well post-doctorates at Museu de Arte Contemporânea de São Paulo, Università degli Studi di Roma La Sapienza, and Universidade Estadual de Campinas.

Jacques Fux (Brazil)

Awarded with the literary prize Prêmio São Paulo de Literatura 2013 for the book *Antiterapias*. Awarded with Prêmio Capes, in 2010, for best Brazilian thesis in the area of Linguistics and Literature. Author of *Brochadas: confissões sexuais de um jovem escritor*, published by Rocco. Holds post-doctorates in Theory of Literature, from Unicamp, and in Comparative Literature, from UFMG. Holds a doctorate in Language, Literature, and French Civilization from Université de Lille 3, as well as a doctorate in Comparative Literature from UFMG. Visiting scholar at Harvard University from 2012 to 2014.

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GUIDELINES FOR PREPARING A SYMPOSIUM PROPOSAL

- 1. Each thematic symposium should be organized and coordinated by two (02) faculty members holding a doctoral degree or by one (01) faculty member holding a doctoral degree and one (01) Master of Arts.
- 2. Proposals should be sent to sillproc3@gmail.com, the Organizing Committee's e-mail, until July 31st, 2016.
- 3. The thematic of the symposia should be related to:
 - 3.1. Language
 - 3.1.1. Linguistics
 - 3.1.2. Translation
 - 3.1.3. Foreign languages
 - 3.2. Literature
 - 3.3. Cultural processes
- 4. The thematic should be made explicit in the symposium proposal.
- 5. The Organizing Committee will send the coordinators of the selected thematic symposia an acceptance letter up to August 5th, 2016.
- 5.1. Once the symposium proposal has been approved, their coordinators will be able to issue a bank invoice according to the values set for the registration fees and the available deadlines.
- 6. The due date for paying the registration fees of the symposia's coordinators is August 12th, 2016.
- 6.1. If a coordinator does not complete his/her registration until the date referred in item 6, the thematic symposium will be automatically canceled.
- 7. The period to register papers for the thematic symposia goes from August 15th, 2016 to September 15th, 2016.
 - 7.1. Each participant can submit one (01) paper (either as author or as coauthor).
 - 7.2. Each paper can have up to two (02) authors.
 - 7.3. Master's and doctorate students are encouraged to present papers at the thematic symposia.
- 8. The symposia's coordinators should analyze the submitted papers and present the structure of their respective symposia up to September 30th, 2016.
- 9. The thematic symposia that do not receive at least three (03) registrations until the date referred to in the seminar schedule will be canceled and the submitted abstracts will be relocated, according to criteria defined by the Organizing Committee, to other symposia that present a similar thematic.
- 10. The evaluation of abstracts (Approved/Not approved) will be held exclusively by the thematic symposia's coordinators and the results will be published on the seminar's official website.
- 11. The list of approved submissions relating to each symposium will be published on the seminar's official website up to $\underline{\text{October } 14^{\text{th}}}$, 2016.
- 12. Participants whose submissions have been approved should send the final version of their papers to the Organizing Committee until October 24th, 2016, in order to have them included in the proceedings of the Seminar.
- 13. Undergraduate and graduate specialization students cannot present papers at the symposia, but are encouraged to audit the seminar.

PUBLICATION OF PRESENTED PAPERS

The Organizing Committee intends to release the proceedings of the Seminar at the end of the event.

Participants whose submissions have been approved should send the final version of their papers to the Organizing Committee until October 24th, 2016, in order to have them included in the proceedings of the Seminar.
