

## Visiting Professor of Portuguese Literature, Culture, and Language

Brown University's Department of Portuguese and Brazilian Studies is searching for a one-year, full-time visiting faculty member to teach a combination of advanced undergraduate or graduate courses on literature or culture of the Lusophone world as well as Portuguese language courses. The individual will teach two content courses of their own design at the undergraduate and/or graduate level during the fall semester and two Portuguese language classes as well as supervising graduate language instruction for the spring semester. Ability to teach a course on Lusophone African cultural production is strongly desired.

Successful candidates will have their Ph.D. in hand by the time of the appointment, and a documented record of teaching Portuguese language and culture courses at the college level. Experience supervising language instruction is preferred. Candidates should have native or near-native fluency in Portuguese. The Portuguese and Brazilian Studies Department is interested in qualified candidates who have demonstrated commitment to excellence by providing leadership in teaching, research or service toward building an equitable and diverse scholarly environment.

Please submit a cover letter describing your qualifications for the position and addressing your experience with or ideas for teaching in a diverse and inclusive setting, a CV, sample syllabi, course description for two content courses you would be willing to teach, and three confidential letters of recommendation via Interfolio.
